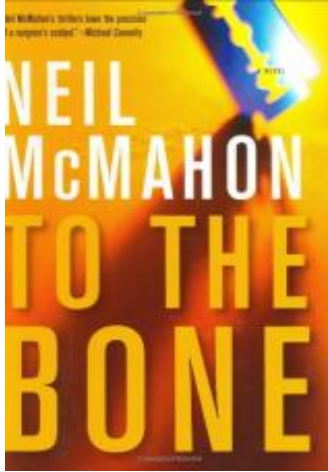


To the Bone

About the Book

Carroll Monks is the physician on duty when a beautiful young woman, naked and in a coma, arrives at Mercy Hospital's emergency room. Against the advice of his peers, Monks makes a radical and counterintuitive attempt to save her life -- a brilliant maneuver that nearly succeeds.

Discussion Guide

2. Gwen Bricknell has obviously placed a great deal of importance on her physical appearance. How would her role in story change if she was unattractive?
3. Monks and Martine Rostanov seem to grow apart throughout the book. Is there something about Monks's personality that precludes close relationships?
4. What type of clues does Neil McMahon use to lead (or mislead) the reader towards the killer's identity?
